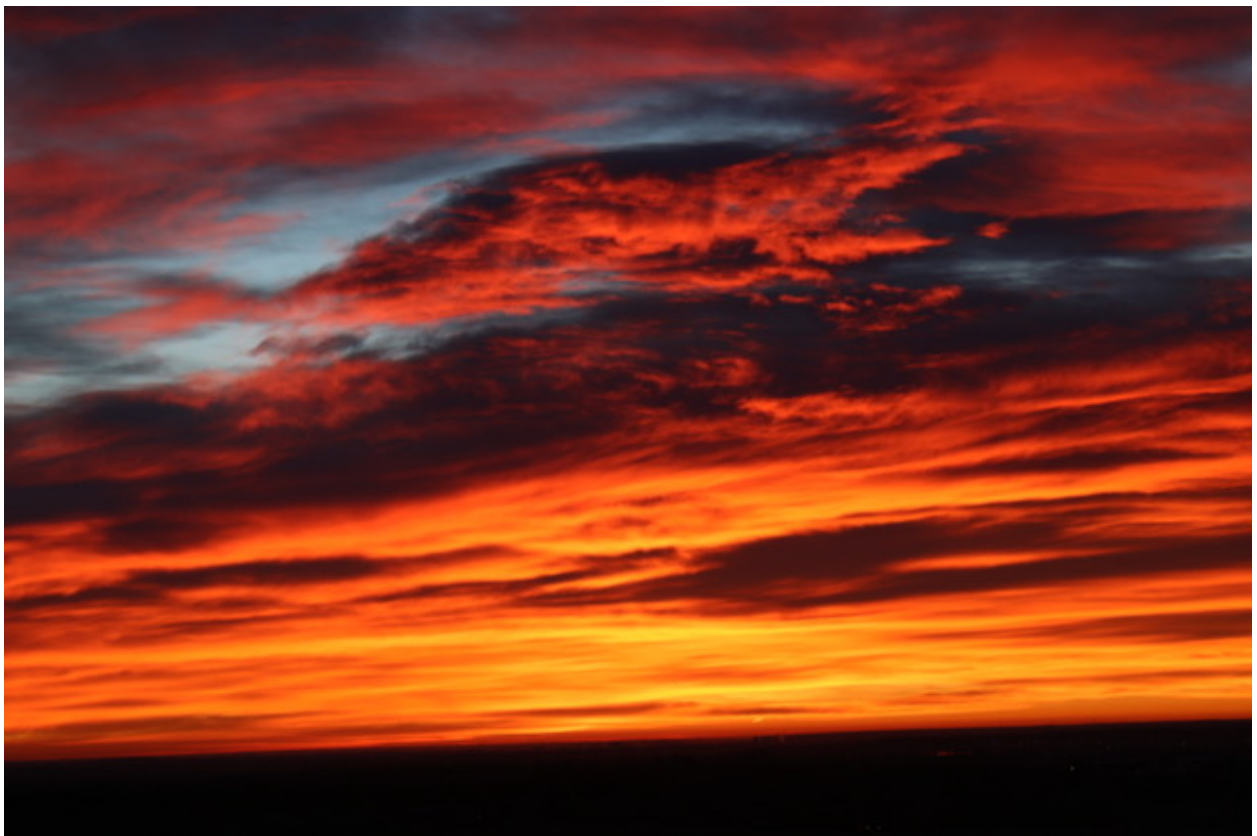
Update:

The little library has been repaired by Lee Evans. Unfortunately I will not be able to put all the books back until our return from vacation.



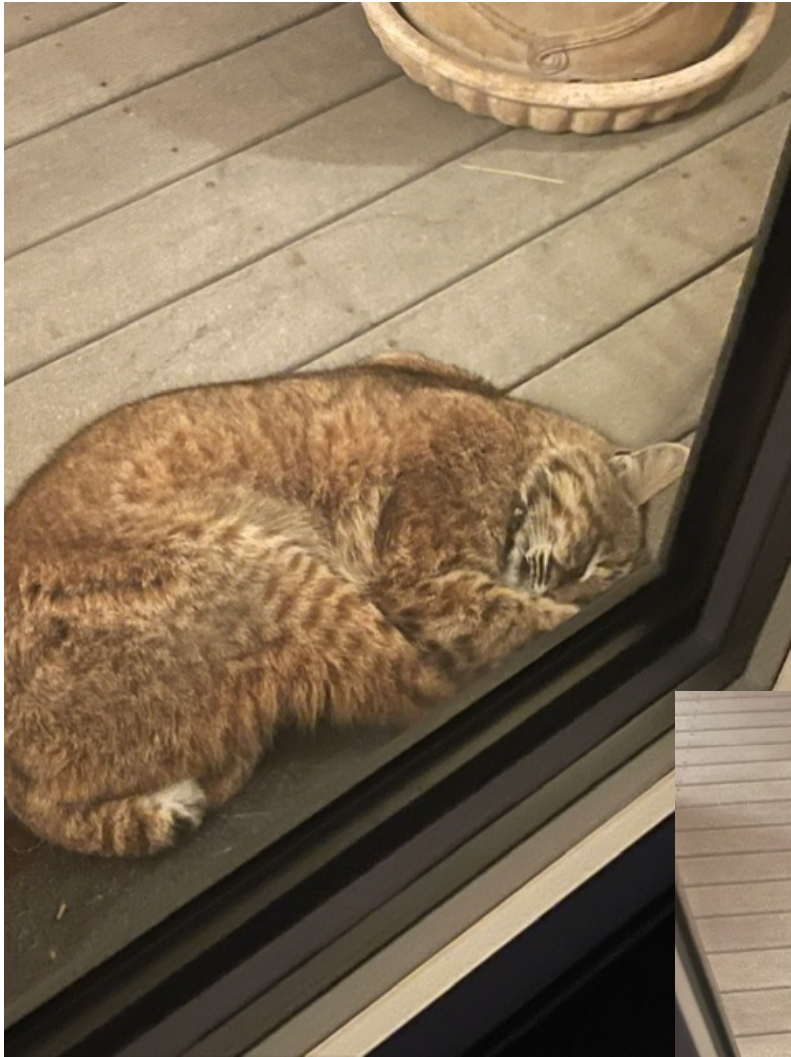
